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
* FROM THE CHAIR AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

By the end of 2027, Fusion Australia will have a sustainable and targeted service portfolio delivering measurable impact for young people aged 12 to 25.

This strategy is a focused, values-driven plan that builds on our strengths, addresses what needs to change, and positions us to better serve young people.

A. Effective, evidence-based services that we can deliver.

KEY STRATEGIES:

- Develop a measurable model of care which sets clear Goals and Success Criteria.
- Develop and integrate an evidence-based practice framework through research, review and analysis.
- Roll out new service delivery models with support through training, practise manuals and guides.

OBJECTIVE B



B. A service portfolio which maximises impact and sustainability.

KEY STRATEGIES:

- Strengthen and grow services that: deliver the model of care and service delivery model (Obj A), and/or generates resources to support the program portfolio
- 2. Reposition services able to adapt to model of care and service delivery model.
- 3. Reduce services that are not sustainable, impactful and/or cannot align with model of care and service delivery model.

C. Equipped and engaged professional workforce.

KEY STRATEGIES:

- Attract, develop and retain a capable and professional workforce.
- Build workforce engagement and values aligned culture.

OBJECTIVE (E)

E. A balanced income model demonstrating pathways to sustainability.

KEY STRATEGIES:

- Build a sustainable and balanced income model aligned with our service delivery model.
- Increase Government income.
- Increase the diversity and flexibility of non-government income.

OBJECTIVE (D)

D. Fit for purpose systems and processes.

KEY STRATEGIES:

- 1. Revise and/or develop critical processes.
- 2. Implement critical new systems.
- Embed and realise the potential of existing systems.

SEQUENCING

The objectives and strategies are largely inter-related and will be worked on simultaneously.

The enabling objectives will strengthen Fusion Australia's business model, capacity and operations, enabling the organisational objectives

MODEL OF CARE

Refers to the philosophical and structural framework that guides how care, support, and interventions are provided to young people within youth-focused programs or services. It defines the principles, values, and outcomes underpinning how youth work is delivered, and how young people are engaged in a supportive, developmental relationship.

Framework of theoretical practice principles, processes and research-informed benchmarks for evaluating and making informed decisions about the design and delivery of services.

SERVICE DELIVERY MODEL



Outlines the operational structure and methods through which youth work is implemented in practice. It focuses on how services are organised, coordinated, and delivered to young people within the broader care framework.

- Service Design and Geographic location
- Workforce and Roles
- Service Streams and Interventions
- Integration and Partnerships
- Monitoring and Evaluation

INCOME MODEL

The structure through which Fusion Australia generates and balances funding to support its operations and programs. This includes government funding, philanthropic contributions, donations, social enterprise income, and other sources of revenue. A strong income model ensures financial sustainability, identifies priority funding areas, reduces risk of volatility and aligns with the organisation's purpose and services.
